





Market Tables

Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. 1996

These Banner Poles with fold-up vendor tables were part of a comprehensive project to restore the nation's longest continually operating farmer's market to economic stability. Conceived of as a virtual side isle to the Market Buildings, these Banner Poles compress activity and add presence to the oversized sidewalks. Further they more fully connect the sidewalks to the market's central plaza.

Seasonal vendors will lease a vendor table and if desired the adjacent parking space. By unlocking the padlock the vendor frees the locking device/table leg. The leg is then screwed into the threaded sleeve on the bottom of the table, the table is lowered and a market umbrella is slid through a hole in the table top and into the hollow table leg. The vendor then sells goods from the back of his or her truck across the vendor tables. Upon departure the vendor puts the table back up, locks

it into place and posts a flier perhaps indicating when he or she will be

back on the bottom of the now upright table.
